Increasing the opportunities for social inclusion of Adult Life-long learners

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ECTS Definition

- ECTS is a credit system designed to make it easier for students to move between different countries. Since they are based on the learning achievements and workload of a course, a student can transfer their ECTS credits from one university to another so they are added up to contribute to an individual's degree programme or training.
- ▼ ECTS helps to make learning more student-centred. It is a central tool in the <u>Bologna Process</u>, which aims to make national systems more compatible.
- ▼ ECTS also helps with the planning, delivery and evaluation of study programmes, and makes them more transparent.



ECTS - a short history: "From credit transfer to credit accumulation"

- In 1989, ECTS was introduced as a pilot scheme in the ERASMUS programme.
- Objective: facilitate academic recognition for the ERASMUS students by providing instruments for increased transparency and comparability, to assist recognition and portability of credits obtained in partner institutions.
- In 1999, the signatory states in the Bologna process identified ECTS 'as a proper means of promoting the most widespread student mobility'.
- At the 2002 EUA Zurich conference on Credit Transfer and Accumulation, the role of ECTS in transfer and accumulation was endorsed.



ECTS - a short history: "From credit transfer to credit accumulation"

- In 2003, at the Berlin conference, the Ministers stressed:
 - The important role played by ECTS in facilitating student mobility and international curriculum development; ...
 - ■They encourage further progress with the goal that the ECTS becomes not only a transfer but also an accumulation system, ...
- ▼ In 2005, at the Bergen conference, Ministers identified also ECTS as:
 - ■one of the key elements of the Framework of Qualifications for the European Higher Education Area;
 - Implementing ECTS would also serve the implementation of the Standards and Guidelines for Quality Assurance in the European Higher Education Area, notably as regards information provision for students and the use of learning outcomes and their associated student workload.

Principles of ECTS

- ECTS is a <u>learner-centred system</u> for credit accumulation and transfer based on the transparency of learning outcomes and learning processes. It aims to <u>support</u> institutions in <u>planning</u>, <u>delivery</u>, <u>evaluation</u>, <u>recognition and validation of qualifications and units of learning as well as student mobility</u>.
- TECTS credits are based on:
 - **■**Learning outcomes
 - Notional student workload need to achieve the learning outcomes

Use of ECTS

- Credits are allocated to entire qualifications or study programmes as well as to their educational components (such as modules, course units, dissertation work, work placements, laboratory work, etc.).
- The number of credits ascribed to each component is a reflection of the approximate quantity of work each component requires in relation to the completion of a full academic year of study in the programme
- It is common standard to allocate around 25-30 working hours per ECTS across European Universities

Use of ECTS

- Credits are awarded to individual learners (full time or part time) after completion of the learning activities required by a formal programme of study or by a single unit and the successful assessment of the expected learning outcomes.
- Credits may be accumulated in view of obtaining qualifications as decided by the degree awarding institution.
- Detailed arrangements for credit accumulation, including the use of notional workload, are determined at national and institutional level, within the parameters of ECTS.

Learning outcomes


- Statements of what a learner is expected to know, understand and/or be able to demonstrate at the end of a period of learning
- Defined as a mixture of knowledge, skills, abilities, attitudes and understanding
- Specific methodological approach for the expression and development of the curriculum
- Bridge between higher education and other educational sectors



Importance of learning outcomes

- Tocus on the learner, not the teacher
- ▼ Positive impact on teaching-learning-assessment relationship
- ▼ Aid for quality assurance (external reference points)
- Provides information to the learner on expectations
- Ensures transparency to the outside world
- Helps international progression, transparency and recognition
